- Passenger Restraints and Electrical Systems:*
 - Understand removal and replacement of seat belt parts and assemblies.
 - Understand diagnosis and repair procedures for air bag systems.
 - Diagnose and service seat belt tensioners.
 - Inspect and repair damage to restraint system mounting points.
