

**HEALTH / CPR / FIRST AID TRAINING
College Credit and Careers Network
Dual Credit Articulation Agreement**

Upon completion of high school courses equivalent to the following competencies:

- List five kinds of training that health care employer's are required by law to document that employees receive, and discuss the rationale for each: First Aid, CPR, HIV/AIDS, HIPAA, and Healthcare Workplace Violence.
- Complete First Aid Training as specified by WAC 296-54-51520 and as established by OSHA guidelines (The Red Cross completes this training in 3 hrs)
 - Discuss patient assessment and first aid procedures for respiratory, choking and cardiac problems; severe cuts, burns, sprains, strains, fractures, poisonings, bites, stings, and eye injuries
 - List the symptoms of shock and describe first aid procedures
 - Describe first aid procedures for treating hypothermia and hyperthermia
- Demonstrate the steps of Basic Adult CPR training. (Specified by WAC 296-54-51520. The Red Cross completes this training in 3 ½ hrs.)
- Complete WA state's 7-hour training program in HIV / AIDS as required by RCW 70.24.310 using prescribed KNOW training materials available from DSHS.
 - Discuss the etiology and epidemiology of HIV
 - Identify forms of transmission and infection control
 - Identify sources of testing and counseling
 - Describe clinical manifestations and treatments
 - Discuss legal and ethical issues
 - Discuss psychological issues
- Complete basic HIPAA training requirements for health care workers as specified by 65 Fed. Reg. 82464
 - Define HIPAA and identify its origins and rationale
 - Identify the standards for compliance and the parties responsible
 - Discuss penalties for non-compliance
- Complete prevention training in healthcare workplace violence as required by Washington RCW 49.19.
 - Define the types of workplace violence and the types of offenders
 - Identify risk factors associated with workplace violence and types of employees at greatest risk
 - Describe general personal safety principles and practices
 - Demonstrate techniques for prevention, de-escalation, and response
