Dual Credit Articulation Agreement

Upon completion of high school courses equivalent to the following competencies:

- Capture digital video footage
- Import music from a CD
- Edit video and sound
- Apply transitions, effects, and filters
- Define (and use) editing terminology effectively
- Compare various output techniques such as QuickTime, AVI, MPEG 1, and MPEG 2
- Compose video projects
- Write and produce a short video program demonstrating a knowledge of the technical concepts, terms and equipment, and video/audio program elements
- Develop and design a pre-production plan using correct technical video production terminology and concepts
- Apply knowledge of cameras, lighting, audio and control room equipment use as a crew member on other students' projects
- Manage resources and time to meet deadlines and fulfill the parameters of the project.
- Analyze and evaluate their own and other programs success in reaching the target audience for which the program was intended
- Basic use, concepts and terms for camera, lighting, audio and studio equipment
- Crew positions for TV/studio productions
- Various types of programming and their structure
- Video/audio/graphic program elements of news TV programs, narratives, and instructional programming
- Pre-production planning and analysis of target audience
- Program development and scriptwriting techniques
- Professional production/set conduct and protocol, working as a crew member within a production team
- On-camera/interviewing and directing techniques
- Critiquing a TV/video program
- Set white balance
- Operate light levels
- Use appropriate filters and demonstrate their specific function
- Demonstrate the fundamentals of light design
- Operate the camera with learned skills
- Compose effective pictures
- Demonstrate Audio design principles
- Select proper microphones
- Demonstrate skills in Continuity Editing, Shot Order and Cause-and-Effect Relationships
- Write a script and storyboard
- Set up a production schedule
- Work with a client using skills taught in this class
